Wellhead Protection Program-Presentation by Sam Radford, DEQ – Map of the Wellhead Protection Area for the community was provided along with a Wellhead Protection 101 handout explaining the five steps taken to protect the land and groundwater surrounding public drinking water supply wells from

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contamination. Discussed purchasing signs to be posted in the Wellhead Protection areas. Motion by Trease to work with DEQ for the placement of Drinking Water Protection Area signs, second by Hill. Affirmative Vote: Allen, Hill, Oehm, Trease, Thomas.

Discuss Hazard Mitigation Plan – Discussed Plan Integration Worksheet, the Upper Big Blue NRD Hazard Mitigation Planning process allows our community to engage in discussion of risk and to analyze the ways it can reduce risk. Participating in this plan ensures that our community will be eligible for certain disaster related grants. The board plans to schedule a workshop, to complete the Plan Integration Worksheet.

Fireworks – Discussed having Peters Pyrotechnic Productions come to put on a Fireworks Show for the town on July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Fire Department asking the Village to help with the cost. Motion by Oehm to approve the Village pay \$2,000.00 and Fire Department cover the remaining cost, second by Allen.
